It was 11.30 when the House met on Wednesday forenoon. In reply to a question by Mr. M. Kennedy Premier Mathieson explained what had been done by the Government in bringing about improvements in our telegrapl service. A question by Mr. M Kennedy afforded the Premier an opportunity to explain what the Government had done in effecting a settlement with the trustees of the Lady Wood estate.

This matter of the Lady Wood estate was a peculiar affair. stated when the matter was be fore the Legislature before, certain tenants of the Lady Wood estate on Lot 67, had purchased their land from the Provincial Government in 1873 and secured their deeds. It subsequently turned ou that the Government had neve purchased these particular lands and therefore had no right t sell them and grant deeds for then although they thought they had Lady Wood had provided in he will that the income from the portion of her estate should b divided between the Indians and the Deaf and Dumb. The Chie Justice of the Province, for th time being, and the Attorney General of the Province, for th time being, were appointed by Lady Wood as two of the trustee of her estate. Towards the latte days of the late Liberal Govern ment of the Province this matter came up in the Legislature, and in the session of 1911, Premie Hazard introduced a resolutio for the settlement of the claims o the trustees, involving in principa and interest a sum of \$10,488, up to that date. The affair went no further then. The present Government took up the matter and had arrived at a settlement with the trustees in September last fo \$8,500. For this amount, the Premier said, the Government intended to issue debentures bearing interest at 4½ per cent. The in terest would be equally divided between the Indians and the Asylum for the Deaf and Dumb, Halifax, and the Governmen would be relieved correspondingly of contributions to the latter institution. Any person who is the sole head of ramily, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manl obe, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending

Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-In certain districts a bomesteader in

good standing may pre-empt a quarter section slongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre Daties-Must reside upon the home-

stead or pre-emplion six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required a homestead patent) and cultivate fifty

homesteader who has oxhansted a prs-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
