

LONDON ALDERMAN LAUGHS AT NEW YORK CITY'S POLICEMEN

Sir William Treloar, Formerly Lord Mayor of London, Thinks Big City's Police Are Too Fuss—Tells of Hospital for Crippled Children, Which He Was Instrumental in Founding—Interested in Fight Against Tuberculosis.

New York, Sept. 21.—How New York policemen look to a lord mayor of London was shown today when Sir William Treloar, a noted philanthropist, and once the lord mayor, was interviewed at the Waldorf-Astoria, where he is staying.

"Do you know," said he, "I was very much struck by the appearance of your policemen. It seems to me that they have such a smug, self-satisfied expression on their faces, and appear to look down on the people as if they were privileged characters—a sort of 'patrician of old Rome' expression, I should say."

"Unnecessary Fuss. And then it seems to me that they make a great deal of unnecessary fuss about regulating traffic. I think it would be best to beat our London 'bobbies' when it comes to that, but I think you have a most wonderful city here. I am intensely interested in it. Your great buildings are remarkable. I think your hotels are a bit too big. One is more cozy in a smaller place."

"Yesterday," continued Sir William, "I made quite a day of it. I was up from 4 o'clock in the morning to midnight. We went down to Coney Island last night. I had heard so much about it that I was determined to go. It was a wonderful sight. I never saw anything like it. It quite repaid me for my strenuous day."

"An All-Embracing Ward. I have here a note from the New York Press club inviting me to a dinner that is to be given tonight. I think I shall go. I like the press very much. You know I am an alderman in the city of London, and in my ward I have a great deal of support. He said in my ward I have the flesh and the devil. The Central Meat mar-

ket, which supplies most of the city with meat, is the flesh, and then I have the Temple, where all the lawyers are, and the newspapers in Fleet street. Which of these is the world and which the devil, you must decide for yourself."

"The Children's Alderman. Sir William was asked about his nickname of 'The Children's Alderman.' 'That comes, you know,' said he, 'from the Cripples hospital and college I founded for the poor little crippled children of London. For many years I was interested in the little ones, and when I became lord mayor I took advantage of my public position to help my scheme along. I was quite successful in my efforts and in the year that I held office I collected 70,000. Of course it took a little hustling, and one time I had to threaten them. I had collected \$60,000, and I told them that if they didn't give me more I would run for lord mayor again. They gave very freely after that,' and Sir William laughed heartily."

"Interested in Anti-Tuberculosis Fight. One of my principal objects in coming put here," said Sir William, "was to find out the most up-to-date methods of broad treating tuberculosis for my children's hospital. I am going to Canada in a few days, where I shall visit Montreal and Quebec, and will then return to New York and leave for the other side on the Celtic on October 15."

"Sir William laughed heartily at a story in a morning paper, to the effect that he was willing to 'take up the white man's burden' and tackle Jack Johnson. 'Tell them,' he said, 'that whatever they may say, that match won't come off.'"

"Why did not the lieutenant-governor hold them to their places?" he asked. "They had a majority of three in the house, and give the people a chance to deal with them. If we had been given an opportunity we would have given an adverse vote and put the blame for the transaction where it belongs. We would have put the name of a man before the lieutenant-governor who could have brought order out of chaos."

"Instead of that we were calmly informed that the Chief Justice of the province, who had already received his political reward, had undertaken the task of forming a new cabinet, and we were quietly sent home."

Mr. Riley had waited. He had waited from May 26 until June 2, hoping that Premier Sifton would make an announcement in regard to the policy on the A. & G. W. question, the finances of the province and future legislation, before he had resigned his seat in the house.

"Up to the present Premier Sifton has made no announcement to the people of the province, but is going through the country making ten or fifteen minute speeches and hearing abuse on Riley."

Proud of R. B. In regard to the fact that in the campaign he is receiving assistance from Mr. Bennett, leader of the Conservative party, Mr. Riley said that he was proud to have Mr. Bennett on the same platform with him, and to receive Conservative support.

"Mr. Bennett or any member of the Conservative party never acted as if I stand in regard to supporting the Conservative party in the future."

The Resigning Habit. Mr. Riley, in answer to the charge that he is afflicted with the resigning habit, related the causes for his resignation of 1907, over the Greater Calgary bill.

"I did not then resign in my own interests any more than I did in 1910. I resigned in the interests of my constituents, and the government begged me to take it back."

CONSUMPTION OF CIGARETTES HAS INCREASED ENORMOUSLY

Over a Hundred Million More Smoked in Canada During Last Fiscal Year Than During the Year Previous—Comparative Figures for Three Years—Outlay of Over Four Million Dollars for "Coffin Nails" Principally for Boys.

Ottawa, Sept. 21.—The customs and excise returns for the fiscal year give one indication of the following tide of prosperity which will not be greeted with general enthusiasm. The production of cigarettes for consumption in Canada for the fiscal year ending March last totalled no less than 469,711,091, an increase of a little over a hundred million cigarettes as compared with the preceding year, and representing an outlay of probably over four million dollars for "coffin nails" principally by the boys and young men of Canada during the twelve months. During the preceding year, on the other hand, owing to the reduced consumption which followed the commercial depression of two years ago, there was a considerable falling off in the importation and manufacture of cigarettes, the total being only 363,295,796, as compared with 398,307,344 in 1907-8. The increase of over a hundred millions in the production of cigarettes during the last fiscal year is the largest on record, and points to a rather alarming commitment of good times. It may be noted also that this increase is despite the anti-cigarette legislation of the Dominion parliament two sessions ago.

Comparative figures for the last three years are as follows:— 1907-8—Domestic cigarettes manufactured, 356,756,130; entered through customs, 15,538,665; total, 382,294,795. 1908-9—Domestic cigarettes manufactured, 457,995,138; entered through customs, 12,616,333; total, 470,611,471.

UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO REAPPORTION ITS MEMBERS. New Census Makes This Necessary—Work Falling on Approaching Congress—Politics Play a Part—Manipulation of Population Fractions Can Be Used to Good Advantage—Size of Body to be About 400.

Washington, Sept. 23.—One of the first questions with which the approaching session of Congress will be called upon to grapple will be to determine when the next reapportionment of members of the House of Representatives under the recent census shall be made.

It is not actually required by the constitution, that instrument implies that a reapportionment shall follow each decennial enumeration of the people, and according to the terms of the act in the House membership has taken place hitherto soon after the conclusion of each census.

Up to 1890 the reapportionment was uniformly postponed until the first session of the Congress succeeding the enumeration, but after the eleventh census a change was made and the reapportionment was to be effected at the beginning of the session following the short session of the current Congress immediately following the enumeration in both Houses.

The yields of the different varieties of oats and barley did not vary much. The average yields of the several plots of these grains are as follows: Oats, 35 bushels to the acre; Barley, 35 bushels to the acre. The cause of the light yields was the very dry weather throughout the season.

Vancouver, Sept. 21.—That Joe Reid, who murdered his wife at Clayburn two weeks ago in a fit of insane jealousy, committed suicide has been established, for his body was found today floating in the Fraser river. The throat was cut from ear to ear, apparently with the same razor as was used by Reid in killing his young wife. The young couple were from Midland, Ontario.

Took an Overdose of Mercury. Ottawa, Ont., Sept. 21.—Rose Cyr, a domestic servant, aged nineteen, attempted suicide at the police court today. She had stolen a valuable dress from her mistress and was sentenced by the magistrate to nine months. While on the way to the cells she swallowed three mercury pills. The dose was too much, however.
