## The Jutland Sea Fight.

The battle of Jutland was "The Day" that all patriotic Germans had been looking forward to for years, and though an unfinished action, it was the greatest naval battle of the late war. It was on May 31, 1916, that the entire German high seas fleet left port and steamed up the west coast of Denmark, but it was quickly sighted by British scouts, and the main British fleet came out to meet it. The battle cruiser squadron, under the command of Admiral Sir David Beatty, was nearer the scene of action than the main battle fleet under Sir John Jellicoe, and of course came into action before the main battle fleet could arrive. The action opened about 3.30 in the afternoon and for two hours the Germans fought very well indeed, and scored some notable hits, the "Queen Mary" and the "Indefatigable" being sunk. Admiral Beatty ran parallel to the Germans and toward their main fleet, which he engaged with great daring. By 5 o'clock the Germans were more or less obscured by darkness and mist, while the British offered a much clearer target to the enemy. Towards 6 p.m. the main British fleet arrived, but was only able to see the enemy at intervals. Nevertheless it engaged them as well as possible up to midnight. During the night Jellicoe manoeuvred to get between the German fleet and its base, and Beatty tried to get between it and the coast of Jutland. But, aided by the darkness, the Germans succeeded in getting away. The destroyers of both fleets tore about like mad things all through the night and fought any enemy ships they came across. The following morning the German ships were nowhere to be seen, and there was nothing for the British fleet to do but return to its base. The losses on each side were about equal. In a sense it was a drawn battle, indecisive and unfinished. But two things may be noted. First, after the British main fleet arrived, the Germans' only idea was to run away, while the British strained every effort to bring them to action. Second, they never dared to come out and fight again, and ended by an ignominious surrender without striking a blow. The Press Bureau published our losses at first, so that it appeared a British defeat, and not till a week after did we learn it was much more of a victory. If the Germans ever have a great battle fleet again, and want another "Day," our Navy will always be delighted to oblige.

## Garden Competition, '20.

Dear Girls and Boys.—The fine weather has perhaps reminded you that the season for gardening has returned. We hope that last year's competitors will all try again and that many others will enter. This year the conditions are somewhat altered. Any varieties of flowers or vegetables may be grown, but the flowers must in every case be raised from seed and all work in connection with the growth must be done by the children themselves (young children may have the ground dug up for them).

Three points of advice are (a) choose the simple varieties of flowers and vegetables such as: alyssum, candy-tuft nasturtium marigold, sunflowers, Iceland poppy cornflowers, eschscholtzia, etc., and such vegetables as lettuce, radish, cabbage (from plants) but, dwarf peas, etc. (b) A small garden which can be kept well weeded and cultivated will give the most satisfactory results. Children will do well not to attempt too much. (c) In dry weather do not allow the earth around the plants to become hard and "caked."

### RULES.

- (1) Competitors must reside within the city limits and be under 16 years old.
- (2) Names and addresses of intending competitors must be sent not later than June 15th to A. M. A. P. O. Box 476.

Gardens will be inspected early in September. For flower gardens three prizes are offered:—1st \$3.00; 2nd, \$2.00; 3rd, \$1.00.

And for vegetable gardens three similar prizes are offered. Two special prizes of \$2.00 each are offered for (a) the best window-box (b) the most successful attempt to cover an unsightly fence with creeping plants.
