One of the greatest earthquakes of recent years occurred at three o'clock on the morning of February , 1923, at a point in the north Pacific cean 51 degrees north and 170 derees east, and in 11 minutes exactly e shock was recorded on the seisoraphs in the Dominion Observary, Ottawa. The centre of the disurbance was just about half way etween the Aleutian Islands and the oint of the peninsula of Kamtchatka. 


