THE Ontario Teacher observes that at the next examination of teachers, second-class female candidates are required to undergo an examination in the first book of Euclid, instead of domestic deconomy, as heretofore. This alteration in the examination course was made by the Council of Public Instruction in May last and cil of Public Instruction in May last and announced to the public in June. We decidedly object to this hasty action, for we cannot call it nothing else, as being unfair to all female candidates for second class certificates. It evidently places them as considerable disadvantage, in asmuch that no candidate preparing for the Board could be sufficiently prepared on such short notice to undergo examination with any probability of success.


