## THE KLONDIKERS BEATEN, BUT GAME

They Now Issue a Challenge to Play Either of Toronto's Fast Teams.

Toronto, March 1.—Manager J. W. Boyle, of the Klondike team, wired as follows from Ottawa last night: "Reports have been published, presumably on the authority of statements made by some one connected with either the Marlboro or St. George Hockey Clubs, of Toronto, with the evident intention of placing the Klondike hockey team in a most unfavorable light before the public. The team's doings and behavior throughout their tour has been carefully followed by the press, and we are quite willing to have our reputations, both as sportsmen and amateurs, stand or fall on their merits. "Traveling all the time, and playing under enormous difficulties, it was only to be expected that the team would lose some games, and they have lost, and at times been badly beaten, but they have always taken their beating like men, and fought it out to the last bell. "The only inference to be drawn from the report published in a Toronto paper, quoting some Mr. Peacock, is that the team is out on tour trying to make a money-making business of it, which is not now and never has been the case. To prevent any misapprehension on the part of the Toronto public as to the position of the Klondike hockey team, I wish on behalf of the club to submit the following offer: "We will play either the Marlboro or St. George hockey teams, or both of them, on any ice they select, and will give them all of the gate receipts, and guarantee them that the same shall amount to not less than one hundred dollars. Further, we will not play any man on the team other than the regular team, and the position of who have played on the team throughout its tour, starting with the Stanley Cup series, game to take place Friday or Saturday in this week. "We have now only seven players, it would be necessary to agree to drop a man in case of one being hurt."
