Scientific Demonstration. — Tonight in the Auditorium Reno B. Welbourn, the noted scientist, will demonstrate and experiment on the marvels and mysteries of modern science.

Doherty Copped the Links. — Following the regular meeting of Masonic Lodge, No. 209a, in the Masonic Hall, Queen's avenue, last night an informal progressive euchre game was played. The prize, a pair of cuff links, donated by C. R. Sumner, was won by John Doherty. More than eighty members were present.

Anarchist Is Coming.—Edward F. Mylius, of New York City, who was sentenced to five years in Wormwood Scrubbs prison, on a conviction of libelling King George, is to lecture in this city the latter part of March. Mylius lectured in Toronto several weeks ago and is returning to Canada on a second lecture tour in the course of a few weeks. It is not definitely decided as to what auspices he will speak under here, but plans are being made for local anarchistic and socialistic organizations to unite to stage a lecture date for him in London.

National Ideals of Life.—The first and second lectures of the course to be given by John Cowie, a Powys under the auspices of the Woman Teachers' Guild are taken from a series on "National Ideals of Life." "England, the Citadel of Individualism," and "Germany: the Fatherland of Efficiency." In these lectures Mr. Powys shows that liberty has been England's gift to the world, while science, efficiency, the power of expert training and philosophic education are what Germany has had to give. The final lectures of last year's course were given to capacity houses. This year a larger hall has been secured, and even greater enthusiasm will be aroused by a course that must appeal to a very large section of the community.

COMPANY HANDS OUT ULTIMATUM ON SUNDAY CARS

Attorney Ivey Says London Must Accept Amendments to Proposed Agreement.

NO SERVICE TOMORROW

Company Objects to Operating Certain Lines, or Into New Districts.

RAILWAY ST. MENTIONED

Revised Document Forwarded to Mayor—Board of Control to Discuss Situation.

London's Sunday car service seems to be as far off as ever. It is hardly likely that the controllers will tackle the agreement problem today, and it is pointed out that even if they did and reached a satisfactory settlement with the company, cars could not be operated tomorrow, as a special council meeting is necessary to extend the time for the signing of the agreement.

The bylaw was given its third reading by the council more than two weeks ago, and it was stipulated that the agreement covered by it should have been signed within ten days of the passing. But this was not done for the agreement was not prepared until a considerable time later. For this delay C. H. Ivey, counsel for the London Street Railway Company, in an interview with The Advertiser on Wednesday night, held City Solicitor T. G. Meredith responsible.

Yesterday Mr. Ivey forwarded to Mayor C. M. R. Graham, the proposed agreement with the amendments demanded by the company respecting non-operation of the Railway street and old Ridout lines, and its objection to operating on Sundays into Springbank or any other district that might be annexed.

"This is the company's ultimatum," said Mr. Ivey, from which it is inferred that the city will either have to agree to the demands of the company or do without Sunday car service, as it has no power to compel the company to furnish the same.

The board of control will probably deal with the amended agreement at the regular session on Monday morning.

R. E. O. A. IN LINE WITH EAST END PROGRESSIVES

Pass Resolution Condemning Two-Year Term for Controllers—Only Experiment, They Claim.

At a largely-attended meeting of the Real Estate Owners' Association last night, the following resolution was passed: "Resolved that in the opinion of this association, it was never intended that special legislation should be secured fixing the term of the board of control for a longer period than twelve months, and, pending legislation, granting government by council in sure, it is sure to follow, the ratepayers will oppose a two-year term. And we very much appreciate the action of the East End Progressives in regard to this question."
