Slight Shocks Frighten People In Tuscany—No Loss of Life.

Florence, March 5.-Via Rome. - A slight earthquake shock, lasting four seconds, which was felt in Tuscany and other sections in the central part of Italy at 7:56 o'clock last night, caused no fatalities and only slight material damage, according to reports received here from various points, where the earth tremor was observed. panic was caused among the people in the districts where the shock was felt, as it was feared it might presage repetition of the recent disaster in the Abruzzi district.

The fact that the tremor was accompanied by subterranean rumblings has given rise to the belief that it was of volcanie origin.

Reports from Tuscany and a portion of the Emilia region say the shock was felt everywhere in those eactions with more or less severity. At Pisa, the first shock was followed soon afterwards by another. Both were undulatory from the north to the south and were attended by underground rumblings.
