Dear Sir—I completed my examination of your samples yesterday evening, and have now the pleasure to forward assay certificate. I diwaye make gold and silver assays in duplicate, and if the two do no come out closely alike I make a third assay to insure trust worthy results. The samples sent me consisted of a piece of very hard, white translucent quartz, with patches here and there of earthly ferruginous matter apparently resulting from the decomposition of pyrites. In samples of this kind the gold lies chiefly in the earthy matter, and as there was very little of this in my sample I did not expect to get anything like the amount of gold I actally found. As you will see by the certificate, I obtained the equivalent of \$110 in pure
