"Ifind," he said, "an increase of impurity in the samples from the intake pipe and pump house well at the present time. I find on looking over the examinations made in June, 1891, almost the same organic impurity. Since that time the impurity has not been so high, so far as I know. The water in the city is good at present and will continue so as the sediment subsides in the mains and reservoir. I will report fully on completing my examination and compare with former reports received from you."


