How the Timber Goes .-- Speaking of the rapid diminution of the forests of America. an Eastern journal says :- The present con sumption of wood in the United States is enormous. 150,000 acres of the best timber is cut every year to supply the demand for railway sleepers alone. For railway buildings, repairs and cars, the annual exponditure in wood is \$33,000,000. In a single year the locomotives in the United States consume \$56,000,000 worth of wood. There are in the whole country, more than 100,000 artizans in wood, and if the value of their labour is \$1000 a year each, the wood industry of the country represents an amount of nearly \$500,000,000 per annum. It will be seen therefore, how extensive are the interests dependent on the production of lum ber. Probably laws will eventually have to be enacted by the State Legislatures to pro vent such destruction of the forests as will be likely to result in natural injury to the country, and it may be necessary to encourage the planting of forests to meet the demands of expenditure.
