

REMEDY FOR THE ONION MAGGOT—Some few years since, my gardener told me the onions were being eaten up by maggots at the root; said he had put ashes, and also lime on them, but they did not good. I went to the garden and found, as said the roots full of fly-blows, quite a number in each joint close to the main stock; they were then from first to water the plants with the watering pot until quite wet, and then to sift the ashes thickly over them; he did so, and saved every one that was left standing. I never had a better crop, and have continued to grow them on the same ground ever since and have never lost any.—N. E. Farmer.

COLORING BUTTER WITH CARBON.—Some who practice this commend it as not only improving the appearance of the butter, but also the flavor and quality. The following is the process: To melt from the top of the butter take a good sized orange carrot, wash clean, and grate of the deepest-colored portion; pour a tea-cupful of warm water to it; let it stand a short time, then strain through a cloth, and add to cream just before churning.
