SIR,

I have the honor to refer to an exchange of notes dated December 28,  $1962^{\tiny{(1)}}$  between myself and the Secretary of State for External Affairs, which constituted an agreement between our two Governments for the establishment and operation of a command and data acquisition station in Canada to serve an operational meteorological satellite system being established by the United States.

On the instructions of my Government, I wish to propose that our two Governments agree to terminate as of the date of your reply, the agreement of December 28, 1962 on this subject. I further wish to propose that if agreeable to your Government this note and your reply to that effect shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments on this subject with effect from the date of your reply.

Accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
