Most English-language students enter the university after completion of from 11 to 13 years of elementary and secondary schooling. Courses lead, in from three to five years, to a bachelor's degree in arts, pure science, and such professional fields as engineering, business administration, agriculture, and education. Those in law, theology, dentistry, medicine, and some other fields, are longer, in most cases requiring for admission completion of all of a first-degree course in arts or science. Challettee to . In the majority of English-language universities, an undergraduate in arts or science may study either for a general (or pass) degree, or for an honours degree. A student studies from four to six (generally five) subjects each year. The honours degree programme normally involves an additional year of study and is open only to those with this standing.
