Visit of the President of the Republic of Haiti - Amendments to Program

Additional information in connection with the visit of the President of the Republic of Haiti is as follows:

- Wednesday, February 9: A bouquet to Madame Magloire will be presented by Mrs. Paul Martin, wife of the Acting Secretary of State for External Affairs. The reviewing party for the guard of honour will conist of the President and the commander of the guard, His Excellency the Governor-General and Mr. Hewe, Captain Adam Butler, the Aide-de-Camp to the Governor-General, and Lieutenant Charles Turnier, the Aide-de-Camp to the President.
- Thursday, February 10: The President and his party will arrive at Union Station at 5:35 p.m. for departure for Quebec City by train. The Presidential party will be accompanied by the Honourable Roch Pinard, Secretary of State, Mr. Martial Petrus, Charge d'Affaires of Haiti, Mr. Yvon Hyppolite, Consul General of Haiti.
- Friday, February 11: The party will alight from the train at 9:00 a.m. and will be greeted by His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor and Madame Fauteux, the Premier or his representative and the Mayor. A suite of rooms will be at the disposal of the President and Madame Magloire at Bois de Coulonge. The party will leave by train for Montreal that evening at 11:55 p.m.
- Saturday, February 12: An official welcome will be given at 8:00 a.m. at the Windsor Station by the Mayor and Executive Council. The reception by the Latin-American Consular Club of Montreal will take place at 6:00 p.m. at the Cercle Universitaire, Sherbrooke Street East. The reception by the Consul and Madame Martijn will be at 7:30 p.m.
- Monday, February 14: The party will leave the Windsor Hotel for Derval at 8:30 a.m. and will depart from Dorval for Note: The reception by the Speaker of the House of Commons on Thursday afternoon February 10 is for men only.
