PRAYERS.

Mr. Sharp, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,— Copy of the Trade Agreement between Canada and the People's Republic of Bulgaria, signed at Ottawa, October 8, 1963, together with correspondence exchanged. (English and French).

The House resumed the adjourned debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Caron, seconded by Mr. Rock,—That the Second Report of the Standing Committee on Privileges and Elections, presented to this House on Wednesday, October 9, 1963, be now concurred in;

And debate continuing;

Mr. Plourde, seconded by Mr. Gauthier, moved in amendment thereto,— That the Report of the Standing Committee on Privileges and Elections be returned to the said Committee with the recommendation of the House that the following words be added to paragraph two: "The House recognizes that, according to the most elementary principles of decency, it is not up to the other political parties to decide which one of the two Social Credit groups constitutes the Social Credit party, and would leave it to the Social Credit members themselves to decide on this question by a majority vote taken among the twenty-three Social Credit members."

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said proposed amendment, it was negatived on the following division:
