PRAYERS.

The following bill from the Senate was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House:

Bill S-18, An Act to amend the Publication of Statutes Act.—*Mr. Trudeau.*

Bill C-161, An Act to establish a Department of Corporate and Consumer Affairs, was again considered in Committee of the Whole;

And the House continuing in Committee;

At 6.00 o'clock p.m. Mr. Speaker took the Chair.

Pursuant to Special Order made November 22, 1967, items numbered 15 and 16 were allowed to stand and retain their precedence.

Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Barnett, moved,—That in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to amending the Old Age Security Act to provide for the full amount of the income supplement provided thereunder to be incorporated into the basic pension, and for the eligible age to be lowered immediately to 65, so that all persons in Canada 65 years of age or over who meet the residence requirements will receive the full pension of \$105 per month without any income test, the full amount of the Old Age Security pension thus being recognized as a matter of right.
