Mr. Fortin: No, it is another one, Mr. Speaker. You called me to order saying that I was not serious when I said nay.

Mr. Fortin: The Liberals will say it is true. It is because they do not say what they think.

Mr. Speaker, when I said I was against the bill—

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order, please. I ask the hon. member to sit down because he did not rise on another point of order but is instead continuing the debate, and the Chair is not prepared to allow this debate.
