- Black Rod interrupting, Member must continue speech until Black Rod interrupts, 1661
 - Member may speak only once to same motion, 4736-7, 4914
 - Moving motion is considered participation in debate, 4737
 - Participants, alternating, party proportion, etc., 1325, 2320, 2515, 3991, 3996
 - Lists, Chair will only recognize Member who stands even if name is on list, party proportion is not a rule, 931-2, 2355-6
 - Member may chose to speak or not, 4593-5
 - Must stand to be recognized, 1207
 - Points of order, Member recognized for debate may raise point of order and continue with unanimous consent, 3199
 - Quotations, use, scope
 - Member must describe document, name author, 1361-3, 2634
 - Must be in Members own words, 1360
