

Each group is preceded by a covering report the dealing with the Group concerned.

At the beginning is a report by the Dean endeavouring to cover as far as possible in a reasonable space the salient points of the whole report.

The main report written by the Dean follows from p. 4 to p. 33.

The Faculty of the Graduate School consists of the University of the Faculty of Arts and Applied Science, but the initiative and administration of the School is placed in the hands of a committee selected from these faculties and known as the Committee on Graduate Studies. The Chairman of this Committee is the official head of the Graduate School. The advanced courses of study offered in the Graduate School lead to the degrees of Master of Arts, Master of Science, and Doctor of Philosophy. (Extract from Minutes, March, 1967).
