that he do not converse with the patients, nor see more of them than is unavoidably necessary. A book shall be kept, in which the names of the strangers, and the Commissioners who accompany them or admit them, shall be entered. Relations and friends are only permitted to meet with patients upon producing an order from one of the acting Commissioners; and such relatives and friends are on no account to enter into the room of any patinent unless accompanied by the Superintendent.

7. The names of the patients shall on no account be disclosed, nor any circumstance mentioned, which can, in the least degree, hurt the feelings of their friends or relatives, or of the patient, in case of recovery.
