for the purpose of erecting a protestant Church and Parsonage there in the Township of Charlotteville and Praying that the Clergy Reserve Lot No. 17 in the 4th Concession of the said Township be attached as a Glebe to the said Church and Parsonage at the expiration of the Lease for said Lot to Donald McCall."

It was then ordered that no renewal of the said lease should be made.

Mr. H. F. Gardiner in his volume entitled "Nothing but Names," quotes
the following eulogy of Nichol from Henry J. Morgan's "Sketches of Celebrated
Canadians":—"He was indeed a man of rare endowments, and in private life
as amiable as his public career was brilliant" and "though frequently in opposition to the measures of the Government he never forfeited the respect and esteem
of His Majesty's representative," but remarks that in 1819 Sir Peregrine Maitland inquired whether Nichol's pension was compatible with his avowed opposition to the Government. pp. 251-2.
