



He attempted to swim across the river, but had only gone a short distance when he threw up his hands, shouted and sank. The body was recovered a short time later by H. Patterson, of the C. N. R. station, and another man. An inquest will likely be held.

#### WESTERN CROPS ARE STEADILY IMPROVING

REGINA, Sask., June 27.—(Can. Press.)—The Saskatchewan department of agriculture reports that crops during the past week have greatly improved, under the influence of welcome showers all over the province. During the past few days many fears have been expressed that thunderstorms, combined with the cold which has prevailed in the nights and early mornings throughout the province, would have a bad effect upon the crop. Speaking generally, however, these fears have no foundation.

#### WINNIPEG, June 27.—(Can. Press.)

—There was a copious rainfall throughout Manitoba last night, with great benefit to crops, which in most parts were badly in need of moisture. The outlook is greatly improved as a consequence.

### CARPENTERS' WAGES PUZZLES TRUSTEES

#### Education Property Committee, However, Decides to Pay Prevailing Rate.

Whether to pay the "prevailing" or the "maximum" rate of wages to carpenters is a live issue in board of education et cetera. Chairman Hodgson of the property committee made a fight at the meeting yesterday afternoon for the maximum of 45 cents an hour.

Supt. Bishop was vigorously questioned by members of the committee. He said that he was not ready to report, as he had not yet received full information. So far the list of contractors supplied him by the builders' exchange only paid 42 cents an hour.

A resolution was adopted that the prevailing rate should be paid from the date of settlement of the strike.

The question will be up before the board next Thursday night, when a fight will be made for the board to make their rate 45 cents an hour.

Trustee Smith secured the appointment of a subcommittee to report on the possibility of acquiring a site for a new building to take the place of the old Borden street school. He complained that the use of the Borden street site for a portion of the land for the new central technical school robbed the children of the vicinity of a school within a reasonable distance of their homes.

The subcommittee will meet on Monday afternoon to hear reports on the properties available in the district.

The committee on bubbling fountains reported favorably, with respect to three makes. Tenders will be called for.

### FRANCIS J. DAVILLE SUCCUMBS TO HEAT

#### York County Sheriff, Stricken on Charles Street, Dies in Hospital.

Stricken by an attack of heart failure brought on by the intense heat, Francis J. Daville, sheriff of York County, fell on Charles street yesterday morning and died later in Grace Hospital. Dr. R. L. Stewart of Church street was summoned, but could not restore Mr. Daville to life.

Francis Tuppas Daville was a native of Wexford County, having been born in the little village of Middleport in 1846. He received a practical education at the common school and later learned the business of a tanner, going to Aurora in 1870, he established in a small way the Daville Tannery, which has since grown to large dimensions. He took keen interest in municipal affairs and from 1899 until his appointment as sheriff to succeed the late Dr. J. F. Widdifield in June, 1906, was for one year reeve and for two years deputy reeve of the town.
