INDIAN IS SUED FOR DIVORCE

CHECOTAH, Okla., Oct. 12.—Mrs. Cinda Richard, alleged common law wife of Eastman Richard, the wealthy Creek Indian, residing west of this city, has instituted suit in the district court at Muskogee for divorce, and asks for an allowance of \$40,000, and also a sum sufficient for the maintenance of a daughter and son born to them.

In her petition, Mrs. Richard says that in 1910 she and Richard entered into a contract of marriage at the home of the

plaintiff's mother, and entered into the relation of husband and wife, and that she ever since has conducted herself toward her husband as a faithful, chaste and dutiful wife.

Deserted After Birth of Children.
She further avers in her declaration that the defendant until about the first of September recognized and introduced her as his lawful wife, and up to that period furnished maintenance and support and provided her with a home and her comforts.

About two years ago a daughter was born to the couple, and less than a month ago a son. Mrs. Richard alleges that about the first of September her husband deserted her by taking her to her mother's home and leaving her on the pretext of going to a neighboring town to procure money for her and the children.

Since that time he has absented himself and has refused to provide for her or the children. In fact, she alleges that he has refused to pay bills contracted by her with his consent, and by his direction, and that she is now without visible means of support.

Owns Much Property.
In support of her claim for a liberal allowance, she alleges that he is the owner of 400 acres of land, 400 of which is in the heart of the Cushing oil field, valued at not less than \$200,000; that he has in cash about \$80,000, and that his other property, personal and otherwise, the revenue from his oil wells alone amounts to \$10,000 a month, or \$120,000 annually.

In the final paragraph of the petition plaintiff prays that she be divorced from Richard, and that he be required to pay her a reasonable amount for her maintenance and support during the pendency of the suit, and such other sum as will enable her to carry on the action, including attorney's fees, and that upon final hearing she be decreed alimony in the sum of \$40,000 from the defendant, and in addition thereof a reasonable sum for the support, maintenance and education of the children, commensurate with his wealth and ability to pay.

RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION SUIT
MONTREAL, Oct. 15.—(Can. Press.)—A suit which involves the sum of \$40,000, and which arises out of the construction of the Canadian Northern Quebec Railway, has been entered here by Messrs. F. A. Lamy and C. M. Leamy of Ottawa, and R. H. railway contractors, against P. Muller of this city.
