Mexican Minister at Tokio Gives Denial to Sensational Rumor.

TOKIO, Dec. 30.—(Can. Press).—Francisco de la Barra left here for Paris today, having completed the mission entrusted to him by the Mexican government of thanking Japan for her participation in the Mexican centennial.

Senior Pardo the Mexican minister here gave out the following statement today: "Reports published in America that 50 Japanese officers had applied for permission to attach themselves to the Mexican federal army are untrue."
