## v. JUSTIFICATION.

We believe the Scriptures teach that the great gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is justification: that justification includes the pardon of sin and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness: that it is bestowed not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.— Rom. 4:4, 5; 5:1, 9, 17, 19.

## VI. THE FREENESS OF SALVATION.

We believe the Scriptures teach that the blessings of salvation are made free to all by the gospel; that it is the immediate duty of all to accept them by a cordial, penitent, and obedient faith; and that nothing prevents the salvation of
