

Bill Receives Second Reading After a Lively and Protracted Debate.

FARMERS ARE DOUBTFUL

Member for South York Points Out That It is Not a Success It Can Be Repealed.

Ottawa, March 26.—The Union government tonight achieved a remarkable victory when the house, without division, passed the second reading of Sir George Foster's daylight saving bill.

On the other hand the government was upheld by Messrs W. F. Maclean (South York), F. F. Keefer (Port Arthur), C. Hocken, of Toronto, and other Conservative Unionists...
