

USING REFUSE COAL TO DEVELOP POWER

Manufacturers of Amherst, N.S., to Get Cheap Rates Thru Remarkable Enterprise.

AMHERST, N.S., July 31.—(Special.) -To-day marked the dawn of renewed industrial life and increased action in all branches of business in the town thru inauguration of an electric power plant which, by affording power at a much less cost than manufacturers are now paying, promises to give the industries great advan-

It remained for the enterprise of the Maritime Coal, Railway and Power Company to mananifest itself by starting the first electric power plant on

to supply cheap power from refuse coal, which otherwise would be practically useless, thru the generation of electricity and its transmission of tically useless, thru the generation of electricity and its transmission thru six and a half miles of wire. The power house is a substantial brick structure, 60 x 24 feet and 35 feet high, located about a hundred yards from the pit mouth. It is fired up with a 750 horse power vertical compound engine, high speed 300 revolutions.
