Stake Race

Three Start in Race For Pacers On Second Day at Exhibition

Lady May Outclasses Other Two Starters and Wins Easily in Straight Heats—Good Progress Judging the Horses.

The speed event at the exhibition yesterday was a race for pacers that have been used for road or matinee purposes exclusively and that have not started or raced in any races or matinee over one-half mile in length since March 1, 1907, up to day of race, to road wagons (any weight), purse \$200, but it did not prove to be much of a contest, as there were but three starters and one of those, Lady May, 2:04 1-4, outclassed the other two.

The starters were Burns & Sheppard's Lady May, John Watson's Pearl Tipping and Isaac Watson's Josie. Lady May marched off with each of the three heats without effort. Considerable excitement was caused in the opening heat by Josie's wagon breaking down at the start, but she was driven by Billy Robinson to the ground. The mare cleared the track twice before she was caught and in her wild fore she smashed the wagon badly. As the event was on the conditions of each heat a race, the mare, also distanced, was allowed to start again. Fortanably, Robinson was unhurt and was able to drive in the succeeding heats.

The only semblance of a contest was getting the position in each of the first two heats, Josie managed to be second in the final heat.

Tourenne Second to Kennytto in Mile Handicap, Charles Edward Outside the Money.

SARATOGA, Aug. 28.—Beaucoup, a Futurity candidate, won the Adron-dagk Handicap, 8 furlongs, here to-day. Falcada, stable mate of Beaucoup, was second, and Fultonville was third. The stable was backed down from 3 to 1. Beaucoup jumped into the lead at the start and led by three lengths in the stretch, but was under a drive to win by a head. The stable, 2 to 1, won with Falcada. This caused the close finish because E. Dugan was waiting for Falcada to come up and win.


