

FUNERAL OF SIR WILFRID TO BE MOST IMPOSING CANADA HAS KNOWN

Thousands Will Follow Great Statesman to His Grave.

PROFUSION OF FLOWERS

Body Will Be Taken to House of Commons Early This Evening.

(Special to The Advertiser.)
OTTAWA, Feb. 19.—The funeral of Sir Wilfrid Laurier will be the largest and most imposing ever held in Canada, not even excepting that of John A. Macdonald at Kingston. Thousands have already assembled in the big drawing room. They pass every minute of the day—men and women and little children, people of every walk of life, workmen, with the grime of their day upon their faces, and the fragrance-laden chamber with richly dressed ladies, businessmen, legislators, ministers, priests and nuns, the latter with sad faces looking from out their black veils.

There is a quiet majesty about the old face. Sir Wilfrid is seated in his Windsor uniform, which in life he did not frequently wear. The body is lying in state in the Order of St. Michael and St. George room from the red of the gold-frosted canopy and the gold-embroidered velvet side.

Mountains of Flowers.
In a little while the funeral will be surrounded by flowers that there will be no room for the passer-by. The big drawing-room is literally full of them. They are piled to the ceiling and they are coming down from every part of the Dominion. Flowers of all kinds, orchids and carnations, immortelles, gerberas and daisies in every form and shape of cross, anchor, shield and pillow, fill the solemn chamber with their fragrance.

And this is not really the funeral. For that the train is bringing hundreds of people to the capital from all parts of Canada. The hotels already are full and the visitors are still coming. All Canada is sending its condolences to follow Sir Wilfrid to his sepulchre.

A Long Procession.
The House of Commons, where he will lie in state for the day and the two nights, echo the constant passing of the funeral train. The procession will be taken by the House of Commons from 3 a.m. on the 20th until 9 a.m. February 22.

Arrangements have been made for the public to enter the museum at the front door and the chamber at the left door, to pass the body and leave by the right door and the front entrance.

There will be a guard by members of the Senate and House of Commons at the side of the body continuing during the time officially lying in state.

The funeral procession will leave the museum at 10 o'clock in the forenoon on February 22, and proceed on foot by way of Metcalfe and Wellington streets, Major Hill Park, St. Patrick and Rideau streets, to the Basilica. Solemn high mass will commence at 11 a.m.

Owing to the inclement weather civil uniforms will not be obligatory.

CHANGE OF VENUE IN NEUSTADT REEVE'S CASE REFUSED BY COURTS

FOREST CITY ATTACKS CONSTITUTIONALITY OF ONTARIO HIGHWAY ACT

CANADIAN NAVAL HEROES.
LONDON, Feb. 19.—(Canadian Associated Press)—Albert Charles Mat-
tison and Edward S. Beard, both of the Canadian Navy, have been awarded the Albert Medal for an act of great gallantry on the occasion of the collision in Halifax harbor in December 1917, between the French steamer Mont Blanc, carrying explosives, and the Norwegian steamer Imo. Six men, including Mat-
tison and Beard, rescued the French vessel from the navy ship Niobe in a rescue boat just as the Mont Blanc blew up and all six perished.
