18 EXILED TO SIBERIA

Varsity Professor Among Them—Police Judge Also Condemned.

MOSCOW, May 14.—The trial of the members of the local Social Democratic Organization came to an end here today. Eighteen of the prisoners were sentenced to perpetual exile in Siberia, and twenty others are to be imprisoned in a fortress for terms varying from one to three and a half years.

The exiles include Prof. Rochoff, of the University of Moscow, whose connection with the party for a number of years has been a mystery to the police. The authorities were aware that one of the most competent members of the party in Russia, but they never identified this man with the noted university professor on Russian history. When Prof. Rochoff was betrayed by his own carelessness, he went to St. Petersburg instead of fleeing under a false passport, and was arrested in 1908. During the past year he has been in the same condition of Russia in the sixteenth century.

The other men condemned include Police Judge Snyatsky and Instructor Prosin, who will serve respectively terms of two years and eighteen months' imprisonment.

INFECTED FROM MILK

Not as Virulent in Tuberculosis Germ as is Alleged.

WASHINGTON, May 14.—That there is a tendency to overstate the danger to children from milk from tuberculous cattle was the decided view expressed today in the section of tuberculosis in children of the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis.

It was argued that the attention of the public should not be diverted from the great and very real danger of human contagion. If tuberculosis milk was as virulent as so many declare, it was difficult to believe how any children at all escaped infection.

WOULD CLOSE LIBRARY

Mr. Locke Says St. Andrew's Market Branch is Not Worth While.

At a meeting of the public library board yesterday the closing of the western branch of the library in St. Andrew's market, at the foot of East-street, was considered. Mr. Locke, chief librarian, declared that the business of the branch has been steadily decreasing and that he could see no use in keeping it open.

"Why," he said, "College-street does more business on Saturday than the western branch does on a week-day. Statistics show that the former branch circulated 7000 volumes in that month, against 4500 a year ago."

He also said that it would be a financial advantage to close the western branch now. The staff of that library would be available for the holiday period and afterwards they could consider plans for a new one, which he would advise to be placed in the vicinity of Spadina-avenue.

Two assistants for cataloguing the reference library were also accepted at a salary of \$540 per annum, with an increase of \$60 for the second year if their services are satisfactory.

The draft of the city architect for a new branch library for Riverdale district, at the cost of about \$25,000, was accepted.

Cardinal Logue Attacks A. O. H.

DUBLIN, May 14.—Cardinal Logue has issued a strong condemnation of certain practices of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.

He says that in some places the Hibernian Society is a pest and practices cruel tyranny. Its members indulge in drinking and dancing and compelling people by force to join their organization thru threats of boycott and even personal violence.

He forbids the priests from this time on to give absolution to those guilty of such practices.

Stealing Eggs, Is Shot and Killed.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., May 14.—Caught in the act of stealing eggs from a car in the Adams Express warehouse, Frederick Zimmerman, a yard brakeman for twenty years, was shot and killed as he was trying to escape. The detectives claim that the bullet struck a rail, glanced up and entered the brakeman's body.

NEW YORK, May 14.—A jury which heard the suit of Charles A. Whipple, artist, against T. Charles Farrelly, secretary of the American News Company, to recover \$1860 for painting a portrait of Farrelly's father, gave a verdict for the full amount. Farrelly contended Whipple had painted the Irish out of the face and made the senior Farrelly look more like a German than a Celt. The jury decided that the portrait was a true reflection of the photograph from which it was made.
