

BLOOR STREET VIADUCT WILL BENEFIT CITY

Real Estate Authority Gives Sound
Advice—Public Not to Be Gulled
by Toronto Railway.

"Do not let the public be deceived by the overtures of General Manager Fleming of the Toronto Railway Company, with regard to the proposed extension of its surface lines in substitution of the tube or subway proposition. The street railway may have been a success in the discharge of its functions to the public, but the real issue lies between the citizens of Toronto and the future."

With these words, Frederick B. Robbins, of the firm of Robbins, Limited, spoke a word of warning, as he stepped aboard a train for New York last night. Discussing the municipal outlook with The World, Mr. Robbins remarked that the two highway bills, which are essential from the standpoint of the city's progress, are: (1) Bloor-street viaduct, (2) Tube railway system.

"Considering the former," said Mr. Robbins, "the Bloor-street viaduct will not only be the best portion of the city lying east of the Don and connecting to Danforth-avenue, but it will also give easy access to the large farming community north and east of the city limits. In addition to that the viaduct will create several new business centres. Personally, I would regard it as a calamity if this bill was defeated."

"The subway," observed Mr. Robbins, "turning to the other subject, 'presents the long sought solution of the transportation problem in Toronto. Notwithstanding any extension of the present system, there will be ample business for both, and I am satisfied that the subway will be needed long before it can be built, and assured returns will accrue to the city from the day it is completed."

"So, too," Mr. Robbins pointed out, "will the subway settle the radial question. If the city has control, I am prepared to bring a company to Toronto, who will undertake to establish an efficient radial service, one that will meet the necessities of the situation. The result will be that Toronto will have the best transportation service on the continent."

"In conclusion," Mr. Robbins remarked, "as has already been pointed out, the tubes will effectively settle the question of the entrance of the radials into Toronto, and the matter of surface rights. The gauge can be made standard, and the difficulty and expense of tearing up the city's streets overcome."

"With regard to financing, I can undertake to bring to Toronto a firm of reliable capitalists who will build a subway, taking in full payment guaranteed city bonds therefor."

KNOCKING BEGINS AT THE LEGISLATIVE DOORS

Applicants for Private Bills Train
Their Guns on Parliament—Expecting
Early Session.

Charter-seekers and other petitioners for provincial privileges, who help to make the members of the legislature earn their allowance, are evidently scenting an early session. Applications for private bills have already begun to pour in, and from this on the stream may be expected to swell in volume every week.

It has been said that if all the prospective railways which obtain incorporation were built, the north country would be so covered with a network of rails that it would be difficult to see the ground, and the great muskeg would be only a memory.

The C.P.R. asks to have validated an agreement entered into on June 12, 1909, with the Township of Tay (Simcoe County), fixing the amount of taxes to be paid by the company on all accessible property owned by them in the township.

The Town of Napanee desires to have a contract with the Napanee Waterworks Co. declared void. The Town of Campbellford asks for an act to permit them to give over the Trent Valley Woolen Manufacturing Co. a fixed assessment.

The Town of Barrie seeks validation of a bylaw based on an agreement with the Canada Producer Gas Engine Co., by which the latter is to be given 25 per cent exemption from taxes, with the exception of school rates, which are to be given a fixed assessment of \$25,000.
