TELLS POLICE HE CLIMBED SPOUT IN BURGLAR FEAT

Case of Ritchie, Taken in Robbery Matter, Up in Police Court.

Preliminary hearing in the case of Lewin Ritchie and Charles Christiansen was taken up in the police court this morning. The former is charged with breaking and entering several business houses and stealing goods valued at approximately \$600, while the latter is held on suspicion of receiving stolen goods, knowing them to be stolen.

Detective Biddescombe told of a confession he said was made by Ritchie in which he gave a description of how he entered Estey & Company's store in Dock street. How an entrance had been forced in this building, the detective said, had been a mystery to them. He said Ritchie told him he had climbed up a water spout and then lowered himself down through a skylight by means of a rope. He said he had also entered the establishment of Robertson- Foster & Smith, Ltd. through a skylight. The defendant, he said, also acknowledged forcing an entrance into F. S. Thomas' store in Main street by climbing down a rocky slope from Rockland road to the roof of a shed and then forcing a clasp on a window in Dr. Frank Thomas' dental parlors. When he was asked by the witness if he was the one whom a policeman had fired two shots at in Prince Edward street during the night prior to his arrest, he acknowledged that he was.


Detective Biddescombe told of being summoned to F. S. Thomas' store on Sunday, Nov. 16, and in company with Sergeant Detective Power, making a searth of the premises and ascertaining what goods had been stolen. 


