HERE FOR SYNOD.

Priests from all over the St. John diocese were arriving in the city today to attend a synod, which will be opened in the Cathedral tomorrow morning with Pontifical Mass at 8 o'clock.

### HERE SOON.

The Canadian Pacific Ocean Service liners Melita and Corsican are enroute to this port from Liverpool and Havre. The former left at 8 o'clock last Friday evening and the latter on Thursday evening. They are due here at the end of the week. The Melita has 319 cabin and 1422 steerage passengers, and the Corsican has 298 cabin and 848 steerage passengers. They are the first passenger steamers due here this season.
