**TWO HUN OFFICERS HAVE CARRIED OUT PLAN OF BRUTALITY**

German-Americans, With Fluent English

Unspeaking Cruelty, Hated by Own Men, Finally Betrayed to Kaiser, Will Be Sent to Front Lines

Boston, May 7.—Bearing the outline of an iron cross which was burned on his arm with an electric needle by German officers in Africa, John Mitchell, a Zeppelin, formerly a fireman on a British steamship, captured by a German raider, told immigration officials here yesterday the story of his life. He said he escaped from his tormentors after the shells of General Smuts' army had torn a hole in the prison stockade where he was lodged, giving him an opportunity to make a dash for freedom.

Mitchell said that when he was branded his captors laughed at his suffering and rubbed chemicals into the wounds, giving them a bluish color. Badly treated as he was, Mitchell asserted that other prisoners fared worse. All were starved, he said, and many were beaten and flogged upon the slightest provocation.

After his escape Mitchell made his way to Gen. Smuts' line and shipped on a British steamer bound for this country.

**WANTED—WHITE MICE**

That the Red Cross has added this work to many others shows that it is not infected by silly or vicious sentimentality—that its managers and members are not the victims of the zoophilic psychosis that has ravaged some other circles so extensively.—New York Times.



**LE CANADA WILL OBEY**

Montreal, May 7.—Under the heading "A disavowal and an excuse," Le Canada here this morning says: "The secretary of state has taken exception to the character and terms of various articles appearing in Le Canada, and, more particularly, to an article entitled 'The Supremacy of the Number of Competitors Must Not Discourage the Effort of the French-Canadians,' which appeared in the issue of Le Canada on April 30.

"Although we had no intention to disobey the law, we now acknowledge that said articles were published in contravention of the orders-in-council respecting press censorship in Canada. We recognize that said contravention has rendered us liable for prosecution under the said orders-in-council, and regret that Le Canada has been the medium of publishing and circulating objectionable matter calculated and likely to interfere with the successful prosecution of the war and with Canada's united effort therein.

"We pledge ourselves to abstain from the publication of similar matter, and any other matter defined as objectionable in the orders-in-council respecting press censorship in Canada.

"Signed on behalf of the La Compagnie De Publication Du Canada, Limited, "Fernand Blinfort, Editor-in-chief, Le Canada."

Arthur Lemont, an editor of Le Canada, explains that he wrote the articles without submitting them to the directors of the paper. They dealt with the economic development of Quebec.



**A PATRIOT IN WAR PAINT**

(Toronto Globe.)

Every now and then some incident comes to light which helps to explain Britain's record of always winning the last battle. One such comes from the cables with the arrival in Portsmouth of a veteran "Tommy" who has just been retired from active service in France. When war broke out Walter William Clarke of Forest Hill, London, who during the latter part of the last century was a sailor of the South Sea, was working in a biscuit factory. His three sons were among the earliest recruits in Kitchener's volunteer army. One by one they fell, heroically doing their duty.

There were gaps in the ranks to be filled—and the father, approaching the allotted span of life, sought service. His silvery locks were an obstacle, and he failed at first. So he determined, as he subsequently expressed it, to "dye for his country," and the grey and white hair became dark overnight. He presented himself to a London recruiting officer, passed as "somewhere in the forties," and went to the front.

"Just the sort of men we want," said an officer, and Clarke was made a lance-corporal and attached to a mechanical transport unit.

But as months slipped by the hair played out. Some streaks of the old grey began to show through. An army doctor detected the camouflage, and Corporal Clarke was sent back "for home service."

At Aldershot he was placed in charge of certain stores, and now it is related that he has been given honorable discharge and a pension "at the age of sixty-eight years and five months."

In 1878 Clarke was a sailor on the steamer which brought to England the body of the French Prince Imperial, who was killed in the Zulu war.
