MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The Trades Federation of Johannesburg, has called off the proposed general strike of miners in South Africa.

The Roger-Miller Company of Toronto, has been awarded the contract for the Prince Edward Island terminal at Carleton Point of the Intercolonial Car Ferry.

Ottawa, July 31—Two cows sleeping on the Grand Trunk right of way at Beatty's Siding, at Mileage, 248 from Ottawa, and about twelve miles from Parry Sound, this morning at 2.40, caused the derailment of a Grand Trunk extra freight, the death of five men, and injuries to two others.

Burlington, Ont., July 31—Fred Fiech, night clerk at the Brant House, Burlington, was held up during the night while on duty at the hotel and robbed of \$1,400, according to a report made to the Hamilton police today.

Washington, July 31—About twenty-five to fifty million dollars of government funds will be deposited in the national banks of the south and west at the movements of crops. Federal, state and municipal bonds and prime collateral paper will be accepted as security for the money, upon which the banks will pay two per cent interest.

Detroit, July 31—Fourteen deaths attributed to excessive heat were reported to the health board today. Many of the victims were young children. The maximum temperature recorded at the government kiosk was 98 degrees at 2 p. m.

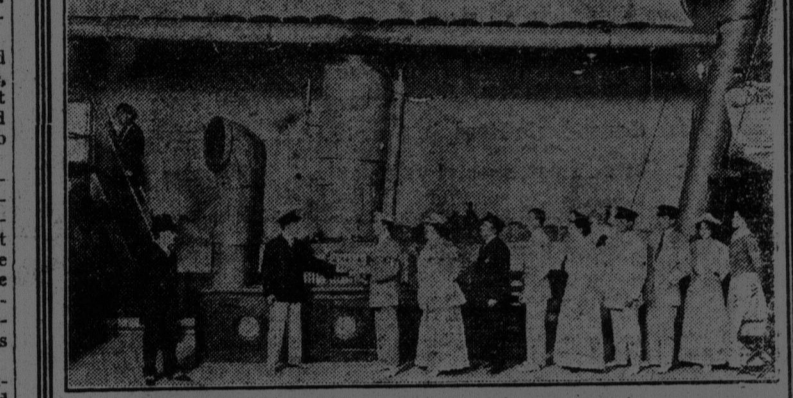
