Public Contest.

At the Canadian Shorthand Society's Contest the Caligraph did the most rapid writing on record, while its manifolding was 100 per cent. better than that done by the rival machine under similar circumstances. Recently at the Walworth Institute, Brooklyn, Mr. T. W Osborn of Rochester, (who holds the championship for fast typewriting), wrote 142 words per minute for five minutes, and in a single minute test 179 words, and in a half-minute test 99 words. Mr. Geo. A. McBride of Ottawa wrote 129 words in a single minute blindfoldeo, and 120 words per minute in a two minute test. Both used Caligraphs. This exceeds anything ever yet accomplished with writing machines.
