Your Committee trust the latter may be so increased as to enable them to fill the building with inmates.

The usual careful supervision on the part of the Ladies' Committee, and visitation by the Chaplain, have been observed, and your Committee are happy to be able to say that the sanitary state of the house, as well as the health of the children, is all that could be desired. The Committee invite the public to visit the Institution, where they will be always heartily welcomed.

The sincere thanks of the Committee are offered to B. H. Collins, Esq., for his kind and generous donation of \$240, and to those kind friends, who, from time to time, have sent contributions in kind to the Institution.

Commending it to the prayers of their Christian friends, and to the support of all in the city interested in the moral and Christian training of those who would otherwise grow up uncared for and neglected, the Committee respectfully render their report.
