I am Mr. Arthur Payne, #2 Lower Gables, Friday Street, Warnham, Sussex. On Saturday 14 April 1945, a tall soldier called "Lofty" saw me at the back of the "Greets Inn" and asked me if I wanted some pants and vests. I gave him half-crown for each article. The total amount being Ten Shillings. That is all I have had from him. The accused whom I now recognize B-88714 Campbell, F., was the soldier called "Lofty".

The accused whom I recognize as B-88714 Campbell, F., was known to me as "Lofty", met me a short time ago at "Greets Inn" Warnham, Sussex, "Lofty" approached me to buy some clothing, at the time I did not give the matter much thought and I gave him about two pounds for the lot. I do not know whether it was W.D. clothing or not.
