FIRST EDITION. THE MINE HORROR.

THE BODIES OF FIFTY OF THE VICTIMS ALREADY RECOVERED.

The work of recovery delayed by after-damp—entirely blocked every where—small fires burst in the mine—The catastrophe.

There was no lack of responses, for down in the earth lay the bodies of more than 100 of their comrades.

There are two mines, No. 1 and No. 2, belonging to the Frick company. No. 1 is worked by a shaft 107 feet deep, and No. 2 by a shaft 110 feet deep.

When the rescuing party reached the bottom of the shaft, they found the odor of the deadly fire damp still in the air.

Again the rescuing party went down. The work of the explosion visible on every hand. The wagons used in the mines were splintered in some cases, and in others had been jammed together in a solid mass.

Some were mutilated, and all were blackened by the flames which had swept throughout the works. The bodies of those who had been killed by the effects of the explosion lay in distorted attitudes.

General Manager Lynch at once notified the managers of the company and sent messengers for physicians. Six doctors at once responded.

When the news of the explosion was carried to the miners' families, mothers, wives, sisters, daughters and sweethearts, they were all in a state of intense excitement.

As soon as the mine experts had arrived, a systematic plan for the recovery of the bodies was agreed upon.

This was tunnelled through, and the party turned off at right angles along a haulage road, and at the extremity of this there was a man with his head blown off.

In the haulage road of flat No. 2, 433 bodies were found, and 15 were counted in one heap in flat No. 2. One man had both legs blown off.

On one of the bodies was a watch which had been broken and mangled as if they had been made of straw.

At a time when the explosion was at its height, the water was turned on the flames, and after several hours of hard work, they were extinguished.
