- Q-93 Were you on pass when you went?
- A- No. sir, I wasn't on pass.
- Q-94 You just walked out of camp, did you?
- A- Just as I have stated in my statement.
- Q-95 There is no statement before the Court?
- A- Well, sir. I have -- I can't explain myself hardly on that statement.
- Q-96 Well, there is no statement before the Court. You just tell the Court what you want to tell them now?
- Q-97 You just tell us what you want now?
- A- Well, sir, I have always had urges to go away, and there is nothing I can do about it. I just want to go, and everything seems to be in a fog. I am myself other times.

 ---CROSS-EXAMINATION CONTINUES:
- Q-98 Did you just walk out during a parade, or just walk out of what?
- A- I am liable to go any time.
- Q-99 I am not asking you what is liable. What did you do?
- A- I found myself out of camp, and all I knew I was away.
- Q-100 And you had no pass?
- A- No. I had no pass in my pocket.
- Q-101 And you don't remember getting off the train and how you got out?
- A- I don't remember when I left the train, sir.
- Q-102 I notice you were picked up by the military police both times in civilian clothes. Did you not intend to come back to the Army?
- A- I did, sir, but I didn't intend to come back for awhile.

 I knew I would have to face detention when I come back,
 and I was putting it off.
