New York, Feb. 1.—The entire or-ganization of the Immigration Bureau was set in motion yesterday afternoon when a public health officer or Ellis Island discovered that 100 steerage passengers of the Rochambeau, of the French line, who had been discharg-ed from the island, had been exposed to typhus.

Agents of the service hurried to the various railway terminals and piers of the Sound lines and in a few hours had found and detained all except forty-five of the passengers.

The Rochambeau, after having been delayed by the fog on Tuesday, was passed by the Health Officer of the Port and allowed to proceed to her pier. There, in the regular routine, her steerage passengers were transferred to barges and transported to Ellis Island and later allowed entry. When more than half of the 185 persons had left Ellis Island Dr. Williams, of the Public Health Service staff, discovered unmistakable typhus symptoms in one of the passengers.

The authorities are now making every effort to apprehend the other forty-five passengers, although little is known concerning their identity, Much favorable comment was heard on the feat of the immigration inspectors in finding as many of the exposed passengers as they did.

The steerage passengers of the Rochambeau who were detained were sent to Hoffman Island, where they will remain until the period of incubation of the disease has expired. The Rochambeau was imediately fumigated.

The new case discovered is the sixth that has been reported at this port. In the opinion of Dr. J. J. O'Connell, the health officer, they are all a result of the recent Turko-Bulgarian troubles. Typhus is a fifth discase and manultary conditions prevailed in the several armies at the close of the war. Dr. O'Connell believes many Mediterranean ports are infected. The patients are natives of Turkey, Austria and Montenegro, which would seem to bear out Dr. O'Connell's theory.
