UKRAINE MISSION VISITS LONDON

Another Going to Washington to Plead for Formal Recognition of Ukrainian Republic.

London, June 12.—(Reuter).—A Ukrainian diplomatic mission has arrived in London, and another is going to Washington. The captain expects to arrive at Constantinople on a route of about 1,400 miles at 5 o'clock tonight. Captain Lafon expected to cross the Alps near Mount Matterhorn, and the Adriatic between Venice and Fiume.

RETAIL MERCHANTS' ASSOCIATION CONSIDERED STATEMENTS MADE

Local Members of Executive Met Yesterday—Placed Themselves on Record as Strongly Objecting to Statement Given Press in Ottawa Despatch — Allegations Made Were Without Foundation—What the Dominion Secretary Says.

A meeting of the local members of the executive of the New Brunswick Retail Merchants' Association was held yesterday afternoon to consider the statements sent out in the Ottawa despatches of June 8, on the report of the commissioner to enquire into the high cost of living. This report stated that information secured from the manufacturers showed that goods were costing less at the mills, and the blame for the present high prices must be laid at the door of the retailer, who was exacting an undue profit, particularly in woolen and cotton goods. The report also charged the retailer with trying to unload on the consumer stocks purchased at high prices and not disposed of before the drop. They also dealt with the report that retail merchants had refused to be investigated as to the cost of doing business and the amount of profit received.

Mrs. W. Daniel, president, at the meeting, and most of the local members of the executive were present. They placed themselves on record strongly objecting to statements such as that sent out in the Ottawa despatch complained of and which had been since contradicted. The allegations made were entirely without foundation and gave the people of the country a wrong impression of the retailer and his position. In connection with the charge that they objected to investigation of their costs and profits, it was stated that they had no objection to any investigation by competent authorities, but they did object to the proposition that the investigation should be carried on by committees chosen by the mayors and councils of the various towns and cities, as they felt such would be prejudicial bodies.

The view point of the association is thus set forth by E. M. Towns, Dominion secretary, in the June 10 issue of the Ottawa Journal: "In order to correct a wrong impression which might be left on the public mind, regarding a report which was published in your paper concerning the proceedings of the special meeting of the committee of the House of Commons, who are investigating the cost of living, we desire to make the following explanation: "The Retail Merchants' Association of Canada welcomes the most thorough investigation into the subject of the cost of living and all the particulars in connection therewith. We have asked the Government repeatedly to appoint a proper tribunal, capable of taking the evidence on the subject from all classes of retailers, and we want whoever was appointed to be chosen from the elected representatives of the people so that they could be held personally and collectively responsible for their report, and so that it would be of an official character. We strongly object to presenting our case before any committee of miscellaneous persons who we get past the sidewalk a couple dozen bags of confetti broke over our heads. That was the worst of it. FOOD TRUST IN VIENNA PLAYS THE FREEZE-OUT GAME

Claimed That Food, Imported for the Poor, is Bought up by Speculators and Resold at Exorbitant Prices.

Vienna, Tuesday, June 11.—(By the Associated Press).—The Vienna newspapers are denouncing alleged speculation in foodstuffs, imported here for the poor, but which are said to be bought up by speculators and sold at high prices. Bacon, which is supposed to be sold at one dollar a kilogram, is charged to be resold by the speculators in the form of sausages at three dollars a kilogram. Ham is sold at five dollars a kilogram, while exorbitant prices are asked for flour. Charges are made that Vienna merchants are selling food to Swiss speculators, who are reselling it in the form of sausages and other foodstuffs. It is also alleged that the food trust organized during the war continues in operation, thereby promoting Bolshevism, and that the government is keeping his own counsel, but there are many who think that he will line up behind the McMaster amendments.
