Geneva, Sept. 20.—The recent international anti-alcohol congress held at Lausanne has raised a great controversy concerning the medicinal value of alcohol. A memorandum has been addressed to the Swiss Government by the Swiss Medical Association expressing the opinion that it would be good for the health of the Swiss nation if alcoholic drinks were entirely abolished.

The general opinion of the Swiss doctors, who rank generally very high in Europe, is that alcohol has its uses as a therapeutic agent, but that in certain cases it must be absolutely forbidden, especially to expectant and nursing mothers. One well-known doctor at the anti-alcohol congress described doctors who prescribe alcohol for women in these circumstances as ignoramus, but the general opinion is that the question of alcohol as a medicine, is far from thoroughly investigated, and it is urged that hospitals should make careful observations of the results of treatment in different cases with and without al-
