"Having gone over the situation in San Francisco, I am deeply with the necessity of uninterrupted forwarding of foodstuffs with which to feed The situation is well organized and the United States quartermaster's partment is receiving and distributing through its channels and through the various local relief associations all supplies as fast as they arrive, but the fact should be made public in all quarters that it will require continued efforts on the part of everyone to keep supplies coming.
