

War Losses: Bills relative to the War Losses:

1. Granting £57,412 10s. Stg., to pay the losses (to individuals) consequent on the last War with the United States of America, and the interest accruing thereon, upon a similar grant being made by the Imperial Government;—the same to be provided for by continuing the duty on salt, and appropriating that, and the Revenue hereafter to be collected on Whiskey imported from the United States, to that object; Ordered, (1830) 38. Presented, 39. Passed, 42. Conference desired by the Council thereon; Acceded to, 49. Report, 51. Report referred to a Committee of Supply, 60. Considered; Report Resolutions, authorizing the Receiver General to borrow the sum required, either in England or Canada; Bill ordered, 65. (See *infra*, 2.) First-named Bill passed by the Council, 75. Royal Assent, 85.
2. To authorize the Receiver General to borrow, either in England or Canada, the sum of £57,412 10s. Stg., required to carry the foregoing Act into effect; Ordered, (1830) 65. Presented, 67. Several Ryders proposed and negatived, 70. Royal Assent, 86. (See *Speeches*, 14.)—Resolutions, that the said Act has been found ineffectual, and that it is proper to make such provision as will carry out the intentions of the Legislature, and put an end to the suspense of claimants, (1831) 80. See *infra*, 3.
3. To authorize the Receiver General to borrow the sum of £57,412 10s. Stg., at an interest of 5 per cent., towards the payment of the War Losses,—and appropriating the duties on Salt and Whiskey to the payment of the principal and interest of the said loan,—pledging the Provincial Revenue to make up any deficiency, and appropriating the proceeds arising from the sales of Forfeited Estates, and all moneys applicable to the payment of the War Losses, to form a sinking fund; Ordered; Presented, (1831) 98. Committed; Chairman leaves the chair on a question of Order, 102. *Bill not reported.*
4. To authorize the Receiver General to borrow, &c., &c.—the duties on Salt to be applied to the liquidation of the principal and interest, and the general Revenues of the Province to be liable for any deficiency; Ordered; Presented, (1831–2) 91. An amendment proposed and negatived; Bill amended, and passed, 111. Conference desired by the Council thereon; Acceded to, 116. Report objection of the Council to pass the Bill, on account of the insufficiency of the provision for repaying the loan, 118. New Bill presented, 119. (See *infra*, 5.) Report considered, in a Committee of the whole House; Report a Resolution, that the provisions in question, are, in the opinion of the House, sufficient, and that it is inexpedient to take any further measures in relation to this subject, during the present Session, 127.
5. To authorize the Receiver General, &c.; Presented, (1831–2) 119. Committed, 120. *Not reported.*
6. To appropriate certain moneys, in the hands of the Receiver General, and the Commissioners of Forfeited Estates, to the payment of the War Losses; Presented; (1831–2) 125. Accounting clause added, *ib.* Royal Assent, 131.
7. To authorize the Receiver General to borrow £55,000 currency, for the payment of the War Losses; Ordered; Presented, (1832–3) 53. Ryder proposed and negatived, and Bill passed, 54. Conference desired by the Council thereon, 62. Acceded to; 63. Report, that the Council object to the Bill, because it comes short of the terms proposed in Earl Bathurst's Despatch in 1823, &c., 64. Report committed, 82. Considered; Report a Resolution; A new Bill presented, 91. (See *infra*, 8.) First named Bill passed by the Council. 108. Royal Assent, 139.
8. Granting a further sum of £3,291 13s. 4d., in addition to the above grant, which, with a sum of £5,500 in the Receiver General's hands, arising from duties on Salt and Whiskey, will make up the sum required, (£57,412 10s., sterling)—the above-mentioned sum to be borrowed, at an interest not exceeding 4 per cent. in London, or 5 per cent. in this Province; Ordered; Presented, (1832–3) 91. Royal Assent, 139. See *Speeches*, 21.
9. To explain and amend the Act of last Session, granting a sum of money for the payment of the War Losses; Notice, (1832–3) 78. *Not presented.*
10. To make further provision for the payment of the War Losses; Notice, (1836) 10. Subject referred to a Committee of the whole House, 60. Considered; Report Resolutions, granting a further sum of £20,000 sterling, upon a like sum being granted by His Majesty's Government; Bill ordered, 319. Presented, 379. Ryder added, 438. Reserved by His Excellency, 523. (*Royal Assent, subsequently, by Proclamation.—6 Will. IV., chap. 37.*)
11. To enable the Lieutenant Governor to pay a certain portion of the War Losses; Presented, (1836–7) 271. Re-committed, 357. Amended, 423. Royal Assent, 638.
12. Petition of Hon. J. IL Dunn, Receiver General, praying that a period may be fixed, within which, only, War Loss claimants may be allowed to contest the validity of the payments made, (1837–8) 158. Referred, 176. Report a Bill, to limit the time for contesting the validity thereof; Read, 320. *Not proceeded in.*—Another petition; Referred, (1839) 78. Report a Bill; Read, 220. *Not proceeded in.*—Bill to limit the time for holding the Receiver-General responsible for the validity of certain payments, &c.; Presented; Committed; Report progress; Notice being taken that the Bill was a Private Bill, and no notice having been published in the Gazette, no further proceeding was had thereon, (1839–40) 352.
13. Petition of Gilbert McMicking, praying compensation for his late father's losses during the last War with the United States, (1836) 165. Referred to the Committee on Claims, 178. Report (*Not in Journ. or App.*) Referred to a Committee of the whole House, 404. Considered; Report a Resolution, granting him £400 10s., 475. Bill ordered, 476. Presented, 509. Passed, 513. *Not returned from the Council.*
