## **BILL**.

An Act to amend the Act intituled "An Act to repeal two certain Acts therein mentioned relating to Agriculture, and to provide for the remedy of abuses prejudicial to Agriculture."

WHEREAS the eighteenth section of the Act passed in the Preamble. Session held in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, initialed, "An Act to repeal two certain Acts 13&14V.c.40. therein mentioned relating to Agriculture, and to provide for the 5 remedy of abuses prejudicial to Agriculture," which section relates to the enforcing of the right of the proprietor of lands under cultivation to demand a découvert along the line separating them from the adjoining lands, contains a Proviso in the words following, "Provided always, that no such découvert shall extend to any 10 orchard, fruit tree or maple tree," and the exceptiom of maple trees therein made, in many instances destroys all the beneficial effects of the said section: Be it therefore enacted, &cc.

That the Proviso mentioned in the Preamble shall be and is The proviso to hereby repealed, and the following Proviso shall be substituted sec. 18 of the 15 in lieu thereof, and shall be held to be and construed as a Proviso pealed and to the said eighteenth section: "Provided always, that no such another subdécouvert shall extend to any orchard, or to any cultivated fruit tree planted for the purpose of producing fruit, or to any trees planted for ornament and not being at a less distance than ten feet 20 from each other."
