for a fishing station. There was a dispute between the Hahmahlillikullahs and the Evickelianeous as to the ownership of this place and it was prestically innaterial as to which of them got its he would recommend that the new reserve to for their joint use. The land covered by the application for Dekinits (221) were on a Buly Limit on the extreme and of Inlet Point; It would work no ham to the Pulp Company to grant the Indians one core, and he thefefore recommended that this be done. As for Applioctions M12 and M14, for Minkylwichsight and Massag respostively, these were not recommanded, the lands applied for being found to be alienated. The land covered by Application H5 (Rhomborahas) was on old village site, not now eccupied, but apparently used by the Indians in years gone by. It was recommended that the plot of land marked "LaRs" be confirmed, this ploy lying to the north of Timber Limit No. 23004 and between that limit and Health Bay. This did not appear as a reserve in the schedule but was / loon Ily recognized as an Indian Reserve and so regarded bybthe Indiane. With respect to Eld(Unlegatio) this was recommended for the reason that the Indiana appeared to be trying to intolligently conserve for their own use and fature benefit the several localities in which shall fish were obtained so that they might derive an assured living when elam cauneries, etc. were established. The place asked for included a number of small and rocky islands, with sorabby timber. Application HIY (Decompredi) was not recommended. Kayala (310) was a place now used by the Indiana and this application was recommended -- that there be granted the smill island in Retroat Rase marked M18 on the map and including about 10 or 15 annes. This island was not mened on the map but was probably Sail Island. lying to the west of Health Boy and to the southwest of Recerve No. L. Re Application S19 (Ryimia) this place lay 117
