MARKET REVIEW AND FORECAST

Toronto, Monday, March 26th.—The near approach of spring has been attended by a very noticeable increase in the volume of trade. Prospects up to the present have not been so encouraging, but this last week wholesale dealers report a large increase in orders. In all lines there is a noticeable improvement.

The only important change in farm produce markets is in the price of hogs. Quotations had gone up 10c in the last week, and some packers are talking of \$8 hogs. The Easter trade has hardly started as yet.

WHEAT

Wheat prices have remained steady on the local market. At larger American centres and in the Old Country prices have fluctuated considerably. From now on crop reports will play an important part in determining prices. No. 1 Northern is quoted \$1.13 1/2; No. 2, \$1.10 1/2; No. 3, \$1.06 1/2; Manitoba feed wheat, 76c. Little Ontario wheat is moving, and the demand is equally strong; \$6c to \$6c in cash load lots outside.

COARSE GRAINS

Maltsters say they filled up and barley prices have dropped accordingly. Corn and oats are slightly stronger. Other quotations are unchanged. Barley, malt-

for primes and \$2.35 to \$2.40 for hand picked. At Montreal three-pound pickers are quoted at \$1.15.

EGGS AND POULTRY

Receipts of Canadian eggs have been quite liberal, but as demand is equally firm no further decline in price is recorded. Dealers are already preparing for the Easter market. New laid eggs are quoted, whites at 34c to 35c, and retail at 50c to 52c. At Montreal supplies of new laid Canadian eggs are scarce. These are firm at 26c country points. These prices will not last long with milder weather.

Wholesale quotations on dressed poultry are as follows: Chickens, 15c to 17c; fowl, 10c to 11c; turkeys, 12c to 14c; ducks, 15c to 16c. On the retail market chickens sell at 25c to 30c; fowl, 10c to 12c; turkeys, 15c to 20c; geese, 16c to 18c; ducks, 15c to 16c.

DAIRY PRODUCE

There is little Canadian made butter coming on the market at the present time. Supplies from New Zealand and more recently small shipments from the Eastern States have relieved the situation somewhat. Dealers now quote dairy prints at 30c to 32c; creamery prints, 30c to 32c; solids, 34c to 35c, and inferior, 28c to 30c.

Good Individuals Backed by the Right Kind of Breeding

This illustration does not do justice to these young bulls, all of which will be offered by Mr. Geo. W. Anderson, Rosemore, Ont., at the Belleville Consignment Sale, April 1st. They are of the kind, however, to grade up a herd in size and production. All of these bulls, two of which are ready for service, are from E.O.M. dams by Francis Bonhomme and one by a grand producing strain of Veltra Triumph. On the Farmers' Market choice dairy cattle bring 35c to 40c. Cows are quoted at 17c to 17 1/2c for twins and 15 1/2c to 16c for large.

HORSES

Quotations are as follows: Heavy draft, \$175 to \$200; medium weight, \$120 to \$150; agricultural, good, \$150 to \$225; fair, \$100 to \$150; driving horses, \$160 to \$220; drivers, \$150 to \$200; sulkers, \$150 to \$250.

LIVE STOCK

There have been few changes worth noting on the cattle markets this last week to Choice operators. Demand is a trifle higher. Otherwise prices are unchanged. Receipts have not been unusual in large, but demand was small in proportion as the Easter trade has not started in earnest. Dealers believe that there will be more fancy cattle marketed this Easter than for several years past, so that the cattle stock shortage will not affect the Easter trade.

Quotations are as follows: Butcher cattle, choice, \$8.50 to \$9.50; med. to good, \$5 to \$5.50; cows, choice, \$4.75 to \$5.50; good, \$4 to \$4.75; com. to med. \$3 to \$3.50; export cattle, choice, \$5.50 to \$7.00; best, \$5.25 to \$5.50 for choice, down to \$3.50; feeders, \$3.50 to \$5.85; stockers, \$3.50 to \$5.50.

Choice milk cows are quoted at \$20 to \$70; com. to med. \$30 to \$45, and springers, \$40 to \$60.

The demand for sheep and lambs continues good. Ewes are quoted at 15c to 25c; bucks and culls, \$3.50 to \$5.50. Calves \$9 to \$10. The only sensational feature of the market has been the rapid advance in the price of hogs. Receipts have been light, which accounts for the advance. Packers are quoting \$7.45 to \$7.50 f.o.b. country points, and \$7.70 to \$7.80 on the market.
