At the GENERAL-ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALIFAX, on the Sixth Day of June, Anno Domini 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by feveral Prorogations until the Twentieth Day of October, Anno Domini 1775, in the Fifteenth Year of His faid Majefty's Reign, being the Fifth GENERAL-ASSEMBLY convened in the faid Province.

C A P. I.

An Act for raising a Tax on the Inhabitants of this Province, for defraying the Expence of maintaining and supporting the Militia of the said Province, and for the Defence of the same.

HEREAS a most unnatural and dangerous Rebellion, against the Laws of Great-Britain, and His Majest ty's Government, in his Colonies in America; now substifts to the great Distress of all His Majesty's liege Subjects in America;

And whereas the Violence of fuch Rebellion has not only been unstended to the Neighbourhood of this Province, but actual Invafion and Depredations have been made upon the fame, and thefe more diftreffing are to be apprehended from the wicked and traiterous Purfuits of His Majesty's rebellious Subjects, against his Province of Canada.

And whereas the Representatives of the People of this Province, have in Legislature, in the most folemn Manner acknowledged the Supremacy of the Laws of Great-Britain made in Parliament, by the 170
